

# **Ecosystems Monitoring - CAP Project**

Thank you to everyone who joined the Monitoring on Magnetic Presentations and Workshop. We were delighted to have 16 local organisations join us to share valuable information on their monitoring efforts on Yunbenun. The following day at the Workshop we came together to work through six main topics of interest to begin developing new community activities for local ecosystem monitoring. The six topics included:

- Water quality (creeks, lagoons, bays)
- Marine monitoring (coral, seaweed, marine life)
- Lowlands (bird surveys, weeds, erosion)
- Marine debris (beach clean-ups, microplastics)
- Invasive species (Crazy yellow ants, Cane toads, weeds)
- Mangroves monitoring (long plot training, crab cameras, boat surveys)

We now have three initiatives underway and we invite you to register your interest to join.

## 1. Mangrove Monitoring - Friday 15 July

Join us for a day out with MangroveWatch and learn techniques in long plot monitoring to help protect our mangroves on Maggie. Contact us for more information on how you can get involved now or further down the track. Opportunities will continue throughout the year.

## 2. Trek for Trash Beach Clean-up Adventure: Sunday 17 July

It's a beach cleanup! Enjoy a bushwalk first as we trek along The Forts Walk, down the new QPWS track and out to Florence Bay (grade 3 - moderate/hard). NEW TRANSPORT WORKING GROUP

What are the future transport needs of Magnetic Island?

The Transport Working Group with the working title MIYGT (Magnetic Island Yunbenan Group for Transport) commenced deliberations 5th June 2022. The group has arisen as one of the directions recommended in the decarbonisation study completed in 2021.

The group is open to more participants from our community to join the 10 interested community members leading the considerations.

The group has listed issues that, in our opinion, require consideration in driving (no pun intended) change in Island transport to better address current and future needs, whilst improving sustainability of the island.

One of the first actions of the group is to canvas the Island community for the key transport issues, as more input will provide focus and efficiency. **An online survey will be published shortly, so keep an eye out on the MICDA Group Facebook page.** 

### The group is considering issues in:

- Transport infrastructure
- Modes of transport
- Transport systems
- Planning approaches that address immediate, mid term and long term outcomes.

## Replanting and fostering natives in Maggie Island creeks

Reef Assist continues on Maggie Island as we have received confirmation that a third parcel of funding will be allocated to us. This will mean the group of 8 part time weeders will be able to continue their great work of weeding, watering and replanting and fostering natives in the creeks of Magnetic Island. While we have several sites across the Island, our main work has been at Kelly Street and a newer area near the Butterfly Walk at Horseshoe Bay.

Weeds removed from the sites are stock piled, and through the <u>VRM process</u> are transformed into humisoil. We now have a pile of finished humisoil which the team are using when they plant new natives and to nurture natives that we find when weeding. As part of our ongoing work we are lucky enough to work with the Arcadia Coastcare group and assist the great works that this group undertakes. Our next parcel of funding will see us working until the end of November and we hope beyond!

# **Tree Planting Day - Sunday 31st July**

We are looking to do a small planting on Tree Planting Day, Sunday 31st July in Nelly Bay but are still working out the details with council – we will let you know when we are sure of when and where through the MICDA Group Facebook page.

## Objectives that reflect what our community needs

As a relatively new group on the Island, the Energy Working Group has been meeting and discussing overall objectives and ensuring that they are consistent with community and stakeholder feedback.

The <u>overall objectives</u> have the aspirational goal of achieving a totally renewable energy supply for Magnetic Island within a number of years.

The group has been discussing how to increase the amount of solar generation on the Island. To this end, a brainstorming session was held and a solar generation roadmap is being worked out. The group has also been looking into what other community energy groups have achieved and has reached out to some of these to find out what worked best.

We have also been investigating energy storage and microgrid technologies with a view to obtaining funding in the future for a pilot project on the Island.



# Removing coral eating Drupella snails

Coral eating Drupella snails are around in numbers and MICDA is looking into a permit from GBRMPA to enable us to remove them. Currently these snails can be collected from Blue zones such as Nelly Bay, so long as numbers do not exceed Fisheries bag limits of 30. To find Drupella, look for white scars on corals and the pink snails (see photo above left). Sightings recorded through the <a href="Eye On The Reef">Eye On The Reef</a> app can help us target removal once a permit is obtained. A permit will allow us to take these snails from all no-take Green Zone bays such as Geoffrey Bay, Alma and Florence Bays.

# Protected Humphead Maori wrasse is a divers friend

Also keep an eye out for this incredible fish in Geoffrey and Nelly Bays. The fish (see photo above middle) is a juvenile Humphead Maori wrasse, and grows into those big blue-green fish (see photo above right) you often see in tourism publications. This fish is a protected species, so will hopefully hang around the bays and befriend divers over time.

#### Marine turtle strandings

Marine turtle strandings have been low over the last few months and we hope it stays this way! Our last turtle Louisa has been released allowing us time to undertake

some maintenance works at the clinic. The MINT Turtle team have continued to amaze with their dedication and hard work – thanks Team Turtle!


# \$60,584 Queensland Gambling Fund grant success for mobile treatment facility for injured wildlife!

Through MICDA, MINT was successful in obtaining a grant for \$60,584 to purchase a mobile turtle treatment facility for injured wildlife. The grant from the Queensland Gambling Fund will be used to create a medical facility on a trailer that will be used for treating injured sea turtles. Currently turtles are treated outdoors on a folding table.

The facility will also be made available to other wildlife groups for the treatment of sick and injured wildlife and can be redeployed in an emergency to other areas where such a facility may be required. The mobile clinic will also be used for training vet students in wildlife care and treatment. MINT representatives will be in contact soon with MIFCO, the Koala Hospital and the Wallaby Refuge for their input into the mobile facility's fit out.

#### \$6,000 PCF grant success for MINT for additional turtle tanks and repairs!

MINT was also successful in obtaining a grant of \$6,000 for additional turtle holding tanks, pumps and filters for the Horseshoe Bay facility through the Ports Community Fund and received a donation from the Reef HQ Volunteers Association for roofing repairs at the clinic.

# Will GBRMPA assess the latest MOUA proposal for Alma Bay?

The Museum of Underwater Art board have published a report on community consultation responses to the Public Information Package (PIP) detailing their

proposal to install underwater sculptures at Geoffrey Bay (favoured out of the six bays considered). In response to comments expressed in the 163 submissions received, MOUA conducted further site assessments and concluded that Alma Bay was the new preferred location for sculpture installation on Magnetic Island. MOUA's Community Consultation Report can be found here.

MICDA is concerned that MOUA does not appear to intend to do further community consultation on the new site, because the information provided in the PIP and related community responses are not relevant to the new Alma Bay proposal. MICDA has written to GBRMPA requesting that they follow their own GBRMPA Assessment Guidelines when considering this new location.

We have asked GBRMPA to require MOUA to prepare a PIP for the new proposed location, and undertake a comprehensive consultation process so that cultural, social, environmental and economic issues are taken into account in the final decision.

GBRMPA have subsequently advised that they will indeed ask MOUA to undertake a community consultation process for the Alma Bay proposal, although it is unclear if this includes a requirement to prepare a detailed PIP and open consultation period, as was done for the Geoffrey Bay proposal.

## Fields of weeds are a big challenge for our volunteers

In the last three months we have weeded across various locations:

- Endeavour Creek
- Fort's Estate
- Nelly Bay Vine Thicket
- Florence Bay

The successive rain events this year have caused the germination of an enormous amount of weed, keeping us very busy. Areas such as Endeavour Creek are showing great recovery of natural bush, picture below of *Hypoestes floribunda* in abundance and another of pulled weeds.
