

INVASIVE WEEDS PETITION **Protect World Heritage Magnetic Island from invasive weeds** Petition closing date Monday 5th June 2023

Christine Finlay has submitted a petition to Townsville City Council: "To list poisonous invasive weeds such as leucaena and yellow oleander as prohibited invasive weeds and impose penalties if intentionally grown on Magnetic Island."

OUR SUSTAINABLE FUTURE You're invited to be part of our sustainable future The <u>Magnetic Island (Yunbenun) Community Sustainable Development Plan</u> (MICSDP) is moving ahead with our community-led Working Groups focusing on solutions to decarbonisation, managing climate risks, improving climate resilience and sustainable development.

The Groups are working with relevant stakeholders, such as Townsville Council, QPWS, local scientists and professionals, as well as community organisations such as MINCA, MIRRA and MINT.

REEF ASSIST PROJECT

Reef Assistance is full steam ahead for 2023

2021 and 2022 of Reef Assist have been incredibly rewarding and the team has grown in skills and knowledge. Using <u>syntropic principles</u> (Regenerative Agroforestry), sections of land have been transformed back to native sites, where the soil has been reinvigorated with the addition of <u>Humisoil</u> and Activa8 a liquid fertiliser **made from Magnetic Island food waste.**

Areas of re-vegetation have been maintained and have grown well, self-seeding a new generation of native plants and starting to restore the canopy. Over the wet season these areas have proved they can assist with erosion control. Although non-native weeds still regrow in these areas, the balance is slowly moving in favour of the natives. Further maintenance of these areas will be required to continue the native plants on-going survival and self-propagation.

Two more years of funding secured from TCC

It is with great excitement that MICDA recently signed a new agreement in partnership with the Townsville City Council for a further two years of funding, so that Reef Assist can work on new areas on our Island! We also watched TCC complete the Native Nursery for growing plants for the Reef Assist program at the Horseshoe Bay School. So it's full steam ahead into 2023!

ENERGY Solar Grant Program - goals and strategies for our future

Approximately 60 islanders attended the very successful community launch of Totally Renewable Magnetic (TRM) at Amaroo on 26 November 2022, where TRM explained its goals and strategies for the future.

TRM alerted a number of Island community groups about the Queensland Government's Community Solar Grant Program, and with the help of TCC, assisted The Men's Shed to apply for their proposed premises at Picnic Bay.

TRM also consulted with a number of Island residents and businesses to assist them to understand the benefits and process for obtaining quotes to instal solar panels.

COMMUNITY GARDEN Choosing the best place to put down our roots

Meetings with council have been positive, with general support for our proposal to develop a site at Nelly Bay. Due to the complexity of the site, Council have suggested additional sites around the Island which might be easier to get up and running initially.

Our plan at this stage is to begin with one of these sites while continuing to work with Council on gaining access to the larger site in Nelly Bay.

We looked at one suggested site in Horseshoe Bay and have a talked through a draft plan. Once we have more detail we will begin a community information campaign. We are also preparing to develop a logo for our garden and plan to work with the community to ensure we come up with a unique and community supported image.

WALLABY REFUGE

Capping your paling fence can save lives

In early February this little Allied rock wallaby was found hanging from a paling fence. Brought into care at the <u>Wallaby Refuge</u>, we determined that there was extensive damage to it's leg. We were also aware of the various effects of this entrapment and are treating for the serious effects of the condition 'capture myopathy'.

We bring this case to light and ask residents to please consider capping their paling fences. Unfortunately this is not the first case like this, and hopefully this message will help prevent more in the future.

Along with our orphaned joeys we also have two injured wallabies in care at the moment. Darrie has had feedback from Islanders with an interest to learn new ideas on how we can live with our wildlife's safety in mind.

ECOSYSTEMS MONITORING Mangrove Monitoring

Our World Heritage Island Community Action Plan projects are developing into 2023 with new citizen science activities and events for our community. One of these is the Mangrove Monitoring project which is being continued by a dedicated group of locals to help monitor our beautiful mangrove systems in Picnic, Geoffrey and Horseshoe Bays.

To help protect our Island mangroves and record valuable baseline data, new surveys are underway for 2023, and are being supported by <u>MangroveWatch</u>.

MINT

A quiet season for turtle nesting

Turtle nesting season has been quiet this year, with only three known nests (one in Geoffrey Bay and two in Nelly). This year the nests have been from our Australian Flatback turtles.

Responding to sea turtle strandings is another key area of MINT business. MINT has trained volunteers on the Island and is supporting volunteers in Townsville to respond to sea turtle strandings. This important work allows us to collect valuable data for conservation and to help understand the impacts on sea turtles in our region.

The MINT clinic currently has no patients, which allows us time to upgrade our systems with some much needed new equipment provided by a grant from the Port of Townsville.

Mobile emergency facility coming soon!

Despite rising costs, our mobile medical facility is progressing well funded by a grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund. We will be taking possession of it in the coming weeks. This facility will provide a much-needed workspace for treatment of the Island's wildlife in need of emergency care.
