

MICDA WORKING GROUPS UPDATE



REEF ASSIST PROJECT

XLR-8ing food waste recycling, weeding and habitat regeneration

Reef Assist teams have been working all over Magnetic Island removing weeds and

fostering natives by staking and mulching to help them grow. With the Biogen now making more than enough XLR-8 from food waste on the Island, we are able to apply this to all of our sites to stimulate the naturally occurring micro-organisms in the soil and create a better growing environment with healthier soils.

Cockle Creek Waterfall/Dog Shed

For the last 8 months one team has removed huge amounts of lantana, snakeweed, guinea grass, vines and many other non-native plants. By carefully balancing the removal of weeds with erosion control, the site has been transformed into a native wonderland. Once weeds are removed the team stakes and cages the vulnerable natives so they can thrive in their newly cleared sites. These are being watered regularly so they can survive until the wet season.

Weeds from the site have been used to help with erosion control on site. Weeds are also taken to our weed pile in preparation for our next Humisoil pile to be created. It's definitely worth a trip to see – but watch out, the mozzies are out in force!

Picnic Bay Magnetic Museum (Creek line behind the block)

Another team has recently begun staking out the site and removing a huge amount of rubbish left over many years. Watch this space for photos and more updates.

Nelly Bay Habitat Reserve

The Habitat Reserve had been cleared along the creek line with great care to ensure the banks remain stable. While some of the guinea grass has been cleared, some has been left in place to hold the soil on the banks. One planting has occurred on the Sooning Street end of the reserve, which you may notice as you walk past. There will be more plantings done here in the near future.

Scrub Fowl Creek

In early September work began on the Scrub Fowl Creek, running between Yates Street and Serene Place. Lantana, snake vine, arrowhead vine, castor oil, guinea grass, cassia and other invasive weeds have been removed and over 200 native plants have been liberated.

Minor erosion controls have been put in place, and using the open sloped areas of guinea grass has been the priority. 15 sites have been prepared. Coir logs provided by the council and material (e.g.: bundling palm fronds into planting swales) have been used to create planting beds to further help with erosion. The site has also benefited from adding Humisoil, XLR-8, and by being heavily mulched, so we are now ready to plant the natives that have been grown in our Horseshoe Bay Nursery.



ENERGY - TOTALLY RENEWABLE MAGNETIC (TRM)

Ask TRM about your solar and battery needs

Totally Renewable Magnetic continues to meet monthly, and is advising more residents on the installation of solar panels. Solar panels are now estimated to produce ~20% of Magnetic Island's electricity. The group also assisted a small number of residents on the installation of batteries.

TRM held its annual resident information session in September covering:

- the recent increase in power prices;
- how to use energy more efficiently; and
- the incentives and rebates that exist to mitigate the price increases.

In early October TRM presented to U3A on electricity, how it is generated in Australia, and why it is important for decarbonisation.

MINT UPDATE

New mobile Wildlife Clinic is available for all

Last month Magnetic Island Network for Turtles (MINT) launched the new Yunbenun Land and Sea Wildlife Clinic, jointly funded by Glencore Queensland Metals and The Queensland Gambling Benefit Fund.

Kellie Whitby, Superintendent Metallurgical Processes from Glencore's Copper Refinery and Member for Townsville, Hon Scott Stewart MP jointly opened the clinic.

The new clinic provides a modern off-grid mobile treatment facility for sick and injured wildlife and will be based on the Island adjacent to MINT's Turtle Clinic. The new facility has already been used by MINT's current patient Charlie and is available for other wildlife care groups to use as well.

WHOLE OF ISLAND PLAN

Moving Maggie towards a sustainable future - the story so far

Overview: The grant to MICDA under the Community Sustainability Action Grants
Program, is for a community-led project that helps deliver climate action. The project works with MICDA Working Groups, stakeholders such as the council, and other community groups.

Funding: The funding has now finished and the final report is due at the end of 2023. The report will be available at micda.com.au in the new year. If you would like to see a draft of the report please contact Aniko at: misdp.coord@gmail.com

Activities: Since June 2023 our coordinator Aniko has held 30 meetings, 6 presentations including the Queensland Cable Network, Zero Waste, Energy, and Transport presentations at MIRRA and U3A, attended 13 networking events, organised and helped organise 2 major events; the Zero Waste Art Exhibition at the Nelly Bay ferry terminal and the Energy Forum. She has also presented at the Yunbenun Aboriginal Advisory Group. The new Marine Working Group (see below) has also been established and groups such as Planning, Water, and Marine are in the process of having their own pages included on the MICDA website.

TOURISM

MICDA is now a member of Tourism Magnetic Island Inc. (TMI), and the Tourism Alliance (TOR). We are building relationships between the Working Groups listed below and TMI to focus on businesses transitioning to zero waste, harnessing solar energy to power their businesses, as well as other interests.

HEALTH WORKING GROUP

The Group is working on the implementation of the Magnetic Island Health Plan handed down in June 2023 by the Townsville Hospital/Department of Health.

PLANNIG WORKING GROUP

Both MICDA and MINCA provided submissions to council about the Stage 1 review of the Townsville City Plan after council presented to the group. Concerns were raised regarding changes to the tourism development criteria which may allow more dense and incompatible development on the Island. The group is working with the council to ensure that our World Heritage values, as well as needs and concerns are included in the reviewed plan. (See additional Planning update below).

The Planning Working Group is also working with the Water and Marine Groups, Arcadia Coastcare, MINCA and MIRRA around the proposed sale of the land at Bremner Point.

WATER WORKING GROUP

There have been concerns around council's stormwater management after they carried out stormwater works at Alma Bay without prior community consultation; in particular the possibility of contaminated stormwater damaging the Green Zone off Alma Bay. The group is working with Arcadia Coastcare to resolve these issues and to establish a consultation process with council for future stormwater and infrastructure work on the Island.


NEW! - MARINE ACTION MAGNETIC ISLAND (MAMI)

HERITAGE INFRASTRUCTURE & PLANNING (HIP)

Help or hindrance to our World Heritage Values as Government overhauls environmental laws

Following a 2020 Review by Professor Samuel of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act (1999) (EPBC), in December 2022 the Australian Minister for the Environment and Water, the Hon Tanya Plibersek, announced a federal government overhaul of Australia's environment laws, the introduction of new environment legislation and released the Nature Positive Plan.

HIP contacted the task force established for this initiative and by July 2023 MICDA was advised that MICDA had been added to the Department's stakeholder engagement list for Nature Positive Law Reform.

In the absence of any further follow up contact by the department, in October MICDA wrote to the Minister about the retention of EPBC Policy 5.1 (2010) Region: Magnetic Island Queensland, because this policy statement recognises the Matters of National Environmental Significance and World Heritage Values of Magnetic Island.

MICDA's representation is to ensure this policy statement is at least retained and potentially strengthened as part of the rewrite. The MICDA letter also suggests that Magnetic Island should be a priority area for consideration for an initial regional plan because it has a variety of ecosystems with high biodiversity, and because Magnetic Island's lowlands are subject to developmental pressures.
